MENTORSHIP PORGRAM

Mentorship is a vital tradition in medicine, and CMHS encourages every student, from Years 1-6, to benefit from it. A mentor offers a safe space to explore ideas, discuss challenges, and work towards personal and academic goals. For first and second-year students, mentors are assigned to help them adjust to CMHS. From Year 3 onwards, students can choose their mentors based on their academic or clinical interests.

To request a mentor, students can contact Ms. Asma in the Office of Student Affairs. If you know your preferred mentor, Ms. Asma and Dr. Susan can assist with matching you. Meetings are encouraged at least four times a year, with flexibility as needed.

Additionally, senior students in the PASS program are available as mentors, offering peer support for those pavigating similar experiences.

Congratulations to our students for their dedication and achievements in advancing research excellence!











MEDICAL MEMES





TELL US ABOUT YOUR CAREER JOURNEY AND INTERESTS BEYOND WORK

I'm a specialist psychiatrist working at Sheikh Khalifa Medical City, where I also trained and have been privileged to gain experience in assessing and treating a wide variety of psychiatric cases from multiple cultures. As the largest psychiatric facility in the country, SKMC has provided an exceptional foundation for my career.

This year, I'm excited to be moving to London for specialty training at the Maudsley toward a CCT. This move is the realization of a career-long dream, as I'll be training under experts who publish the guidelines I've used throughout my training and clinical practice. I can't wait for this new chapter.

Outside of work, I have a deep love for art, film, and literature - all forms of human expression. Since medical school, I've been making short films that explore social issues, such as substance misuse. Two of my films were screened at the Cannes Film Festival, and another was shown on BBC Arabia.

My husband and I also welcomed our first son this year. We're excited to raise him with a love for science, art, and hiking, nurturing the same curiosity and passion we share.

WHAT MOMENTS FROM YOUR TIME AT CMHS-UAEU DO YOU APPRECIATE THE MOST?

I learned this the hard way, but it ultimately strengthened my resolve to pursue the career I wanted. At 3 AM, when you're with a patient, it's your love for the work that fuels you. When you choose what you love, it won't feel like just a job- it's a privilege to be exactly where you're meant to be, providing a service you're proud of.

As a psychiatrist, I find the work incredibly rewarding, though I know it's not for everyone. I would say the ones who join are the inquisitive types who don't believe that patients fit into boxes nor is it ever black or white.. the complexity of what we deal with is part of the intrigue. That responsibility, that trust - it's what makes this path truly extraordinary.
