



Aim to promote culture of emergency and crisis in the university community by providing support, skills and knowledge to deal with emergency challenges in cooperation with the authorities concerned with emergency and crisis management and volunteer agencies both internal and external.







Fire and Emergency Response Drill

According to UAE fire and life safety code; training shall be arranged for building occupants (Staff, Student, Visitors etc.), to familiarize the occupants with building emergency action plan.

Emergency evacuation drills for the 2nd half of the 2022 completed in Maqam 1,2,3,4, Seh Bin Ammar & Tawam Hostels. Everyone involved displayed good participation across hostel sites the overall response time was commendable.

Fire and emergency response drills enable UAEU to fulfil legal requirements by familiarising building occupants on safe evacuation procedures.

- Raise awareness of unsafe practices by briefing occupants on fire safety, the effect of noise, legal implications of activating false fire alarm and the danger of covering smoke detectors.
- Inform students of UAE University hostel accommodation prohibited items which must be removed to ensure the safety of building occupants, protect property and prevent false fire alarm.
- Train individuals to be able to manage and control a fire emergency incident effectively.

- UAEU also benefit from the exercises by learning how to improve, organise and streamline resources.
 Highlight areas of the firefighting system that did not work as designed and introduce remedial measures.
- FMDHS key training initiatives is to improve positive Occupational health and safety culture among all stakeholders.

Reasons for conducting fire drills:



Case Study Student housing Fire

Two people injured after a fire engulfed a student accommodation block which houses students from the University of Bolton in northern England

- A student stated that she initially dismissed the alarm because it goes off multiple times a day
- Other students
 confirmed they go
 off almost every day
 leading to confusion
 over whether it was drill
 or false alarm



Bakhoor ,Candles and Incense within UAEU premises are banned

Oven, Electric grills & frying pan are banned

Usage of Gas stove and electric stove / cooker within UAEU premises are banned

Smoking in all UAE University Campus premises is banned by law

Cooking inside bedroom is not allowed

Overloading extension of power point using multiple socket is not allowed

Cooking is only permitted inside buildings with a kitchen only using induction cooker

Fridges must be no larger than 60ltr capacity and maximum height of 600mm. Fridge must be stored inside student bedroom

Rice cooker, kettles and micro wave must be used in pantry areas

Switch off electric appliance before leaving your bedroom and accommodation.

Never pull down the manual call point unless in a real fire Emergency situation

Do not misuse the fire extinguisher or any firefighting equipment

Do not cover the ceiling lights in the pantry area or corridor with decoration paper

Do not cover the smoke detector, this will impact the safety of all students in the building.

Unauthorized items will be immediately removed without informing you

If you hear a fire alarm in your building, safely evacuate the building immediately and muster at the Assembly Point.



Behaviour Based Safety Management (BBSM)-A Tool to Achieve Safety Excellance Concept

Achieving higher safety performance is always a vision of management commitment to implement effectively OH&S system and there by inculcate safety as a culture within the organization and improve further towards excellence. Though the OH&S system is defined, established, implemented, and maintained throughout the organization and progressed well in raising the safety standard to a significant extent, still some of them have realized that safety level reaches a plateau curve over a period of time. Organization came to know that traditional method of safety management focusing on working environment and safe system of work are not able to control the seemingly stubborn unsafe behaviours of community. Let's analyze this trending topic further to explore the reasons and look for a paradigm shift

in traditional approach. Organizations looks for various traditional means/methods to improve the safety performance periodically and have been attempting to improve safety by way of instructions, education, reward, and punishments... etc. However, such methods of attitude change have limitations. According to Thomas R Krause, "The goal is to change safety related behaviour and usually organizations post slogans, hold meeting, urging people to have change of thinking about safety. Behaviour science points out that when a change of behaviour is the goal, there is good possibility that "CHANGED BEHAVIOUR WILL ALSO CHANGE ATTITUDE".

Unsafe Behaviours

It has been observed that most of the cases people tend to do/repeat unsafe act due to ignorance/ unaware of consequences, oversight, complacence ,enthusiasm, and prejudice.

Over a period of experience at work people tend to go in a mode of complacency and due to over confidence, they tend to do unsafe act because they might not have experienced any type of injury or incident.

But the majority of behavioral/ attitude issue needs to be addressed in a scientific way for better result.

Here it comes the concept of Behaviour-Based Safety Management (BBSM) and its application in organizations. The basic purpose of this concept is to influence the people for safe work habits.It is a PROACTIVE APPROACH to genuinely help people to follow safe work practice on the jobs. Here the shift in approach is to focus on number of safe/ positive behaviour in a task rather than highlighting on unsafe behaviour/act. however during the course of program providing on the spot feedback with caring approach to correct at unsafe behaviours and repeating the exercise over a period of time.

THE APPLICATION OF THIS METHOD INVOLVES 4-STEP METHOD:

Intervene and Influence to Correct Unsafe behaviour

Measure Results and Monitor Trend

CALCULATION OF PERFORMANCE INDEX

% of Safe Behaviour = Total Number of Safe Behaviours X 100

Total no. of Safe Behaviours + Total no. of Unsafe Behaviours

As time goes, the percentage is likely to improve and reflect in reduction of unsafe act. The trends are monitored and program correction applied as necessary after say 8 to 12 months.

Organization can decide various methods of motivation/schemes to improve further percentage of safe behaviour or increase in rate of improvement in safe behaviour of an individual.

Behaviours with positive consequences tend to be repeated, whereas behaviours with negative consequences tend to be avoided. Instead of making people avoid unsafe behaviours, if an endeavour is made to yield visible benefits of safe behaviour, employees will tend to repeat safe actions. Thus, in the long run, with consistent efforts safety becomes a habit or culture of each employee.
